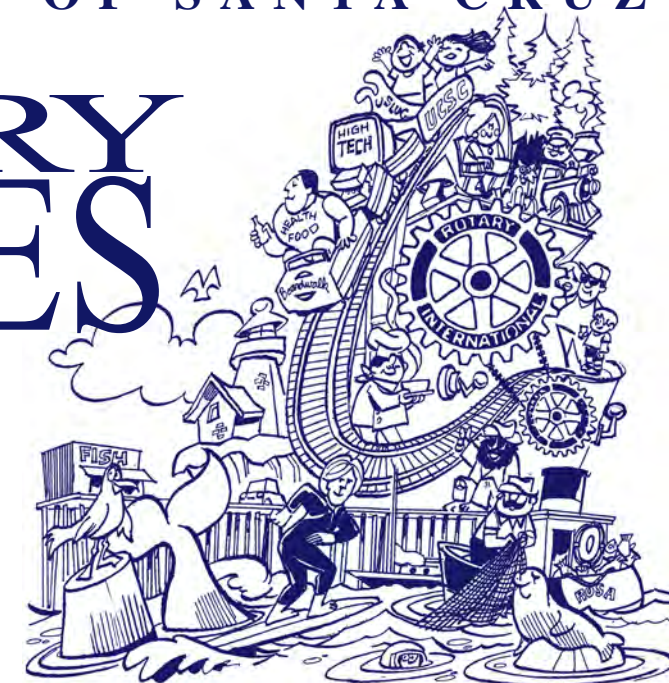

## Dr. Martin Fishman Seeing Again in Guatemala

Seeing Again in Guatemala co-Director Dr. Marty Fishman gave us his annual report on the progress and status of this wonderful program that was started in the 1960's by Santa Cruz Rotarian Dr. Keith Mackenzie.



The program diagnoses and treats vision problems that afflict people in the impoverished, agricultural community in and around the village of Santo Tomás La Unión. The clinic in which Seeing Again Guatemala operates is funded by the Diocese of Helena, MT, as well as Los Gatos Rotary, of which Marty is President-Elect.

Marty and his colleagues visit the clinic there every six months. "We can do the most for people with cataracts," says Marty, explaining that agricultural workers have heavy exposure to sunlight and relatively poor diets, making them more subject to this affliction at an early age.

The visiting doctors also treat certain forms of glaucoma, including some that can be treated with newer technology that uses laser techniques that eliminate the need for eyedrop applications, which patients are unreliable about carrying out.

Patients come from miles around during times when the team is at the clinic, often traveling by foot. By Wednesday they have a full schedule for a five-day stay. During the last visit the group did over 250 consultations and performed 72 surgical procedures. The team has treated over 10,000 patients at the clinic since 1996.

He presented several example patients, including Diego, a young man afflicted with diabetes which caused cataract blindness at an early age. Diego could not see to give himself insulin injections and so would have died without surgery. Today he has 20/20 vision and works as an electrician and handyman at the clinic.

"We are privileged to keep this project going," said Marty, adding, "and most grateful to Keith McKenzie for getting it started."
