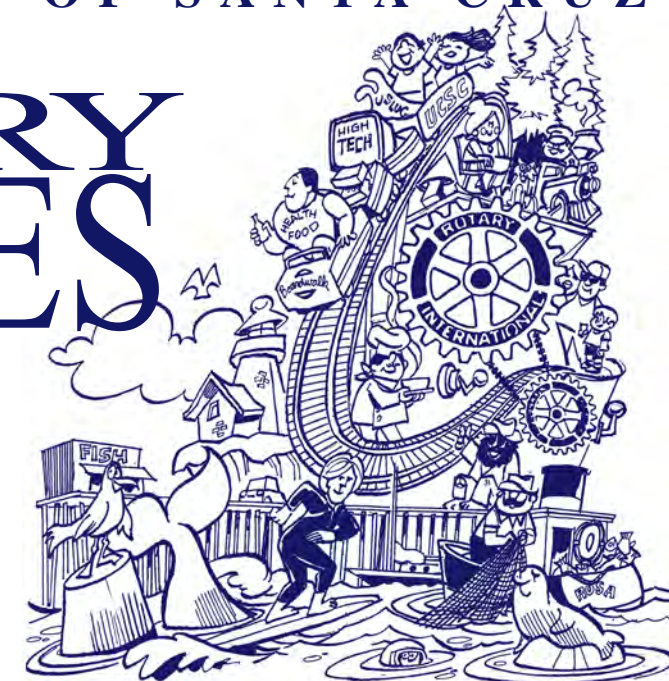

Santa Cruz County

A Time of Progress and A First-Ever Strategic Plan

Santa Cruz County may seem like a small organization, but it's not, with 1.2 million square feet of real property, one of the largest employee populations in the county, serving over 140,000 citizens dependent on municipal services.



The County includes a large unincorporated area to be policed, fire protected, and managed. The county is also required to provide all the California-mandated services.

The County's new Strategic Plan presented by County Administrative Officer Carlos Palacios follows the success of such a plan in the City of Watsonville and includes large projects and goals, such as comprehensive health and safety, reliable transportation, a dynamic economy, attainable housing, a sustainable environment and operational excellence. The goals are to make Santa Cruz County a safe, culturally diverse community that is affordable, economically

inclusive and environmentally vibrant. They built on values that include accountability, collaboration, compassion, effectiveness, innovation, respect, support, transparency, and trust.

Citizen support for these values and plans is shown by passage of Measure G to support public safety and parks and money to address the homeless population.

Supervisor Bruce McPherson noted that the homeless issue is difficult to solve and that the County is looking at several solution combinations that include closing the River Street camp and disbursing people into different areas of the county.



Other programs that will make a difference to Santa Cruz County include the Monterey Bay Community Power Authority, a co-op designed to maximize the distribution of renewable power in the Santa Cruz, Monterey and San Benito County areas. It is designed to provide power through the PG&E distribution network to 270,000 customers at a 3% reduction in the cost of electricity and has received wide acceptance.
