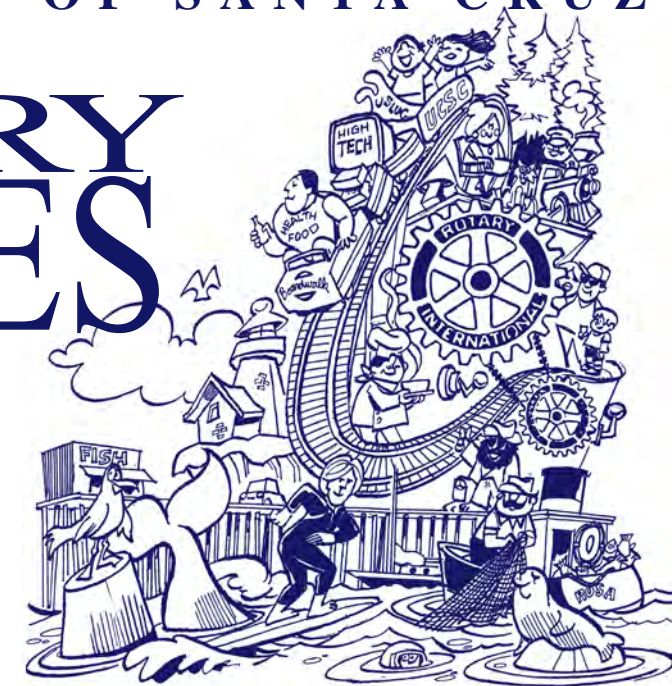

Jewel Theater Pros Break The Dramaturge Code

Artistic Director Julie James opened by explaining that there is controversy in the theater community about the definition of "dramaturge." However, there is no question that Susan Myer Silton is he Dramaturge at the Jewel theatre in Santa Cruz.



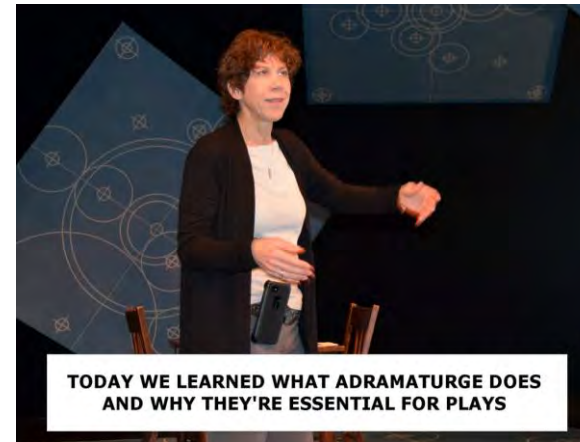
Susan said a dramaturge makes the context of a play real for the actors in a production so they can do their job of making the play real for the audience. She gave several examples of how that process works, including interactions with the director, set builders, costume designers, and so on.

She talked at length about being dramaturge for "Breaking the Code" which is now playing at the Jewel. The play explains how Alan Turing, who literally won World War II by



breaking Germany's Enigma communications code, became a security risk and lost his standing.

To do that the play reveals Alan Turing the man and tells the story of how, after the war, his personal life as a homosexual male destroyed his career and ultimately his life. He was convicted of gross indecency, the crime of committing a homosexual act, which cost him his position with the British Intelligence service because gay men were considered to be security risks.

As dramaturge, Susan had to build the context of the early 1950's which included a deep fear of Russians in the early stages of the Cold War. In addition to making him a security risk his crime turned people against this otherwise likeable man.

The value of his work during the war, and the work itself, was top secret information and was not revealed until about 30 years after his suicide.
