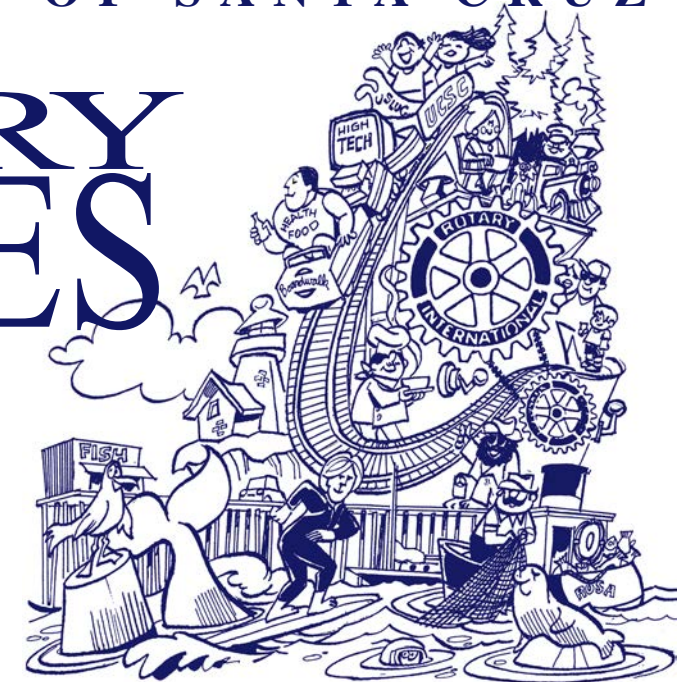

PROGRAM SPEAKER

Dr. Grant Hartzog, a professor at UCSC, talked about some of the challenges that perspective medical students and future doctors in Santa Cruz County face. Students must complete internships to complete medical school. However, most of the intern placements have already been absorbed by the longer standing science/biology programs. Dr. Hartzog described some possible solutions for the future such as forming partnerships with the growing numbers of Kaiser facilities.

Students that graduate from UCSC are encouraged to work in this community. However, this is proving to be difficult since wages are significantly higher over in Santa Clara County. The housing shortage is also a significant deterrent.

More affordable delivery systems are also being considered. Telemedicine is a possible option for many patients. Increasing the use of mid-level practitioners (PA) has already improved affordability. Medical professionals will have to continue to be innovative to address ongoing issues.
