

Detective Report

Masi Bayless filled in for Aleene Althouse this week.

Masi dubbed this week's report the "Vaccine Detective Report." As someone who knows 35 people who have died from Covid, Masi is very much an advocate for the vaccine.

She spent the first part of her report advising what is in the available vaccines, which is essentially mRNA, lipids, salt.

Masi also spent a good amount of time myth busting:

- Does the vaccine give you the "mark of the beast?" No
- Are vaccines made from aborted fetuses? No
- Can the vaccine cause infertility or miscarriage? No
- How many people have died from the vaccine? 126 million vaccinated, 0 deaths

Even with your vaccinations complete, it is advised to continue to take precautions and refrain from unnecessary traveling due to the new variants of the virus that are circulating.

Program

Native Animal Rescue

Christine Wilkinson is a volunteer for Native Animal Rescue. Being passionate about our local native animals, she is involved with wild animal rescues and releases, as well as training for new volunteers. She has experience rehabilitating a variety of wild animals including turkeys, screech owls, ducks, Canadian geese, squirrels and opossums.

Native Animal Rescue (NAR) celebrated their 40th anniversary this year. They serve the community by receiving and caring for distressed wild animals that are brought into their care. The SPCA and members of our community can bring animals into the NAR center.

The number of animals brought in by year:

2017 - 2, 434
2019 - 2,518
2020 - 3,000

The animals are served by a group of expert rehabilitators, made up of dedicated volunteers with extensive training. The center is located on 17th Avenue and has helped with local foxes, raccoons, opossums, fawns, rabbits, and birds to name a few.

NAR operates by way of the 3 "R's" -

- * Rescue: they will come out to the site in an ambulance equipped for animals
- * Rehabilitate: includes an examination/diagnosis, medical attention, time to grow in safe/ enclosed spaces

* Release: the philosophy is, "What comes from the wild must return to the wild."

Another role of NAR is to protect and educate. They partner with a number of agencies to educate and support:

- Reduction of plastic pollution
- Eagle Scout projects
- Squirrel boxes
- Owl boxes
- Life labs

NAR is involved in a number of community education efforts such as home school events, classroom education, camps, nature festivals, and youth programs.
