

Program - Chef Jessica Yarr

Chef Jessica Yarr graduated from Cordon Bleu 2004. She was born and raised in Santa Cruz. Fun fact - her parents own the Big Foot Museum in Felton! As a kid her mom was ill. As a result, Jessica did a lot of cooking starting at a young age and she loved it. She always wanted to be a chef.

She started at Theo's restaurant doing pastry. Eventually she took over as exec chef at 22 y/o. She then went to Gabriella Cafe, then to River Cafe when it was a cheese shop. She also worked at Penny Ice-creamery as their pastry chef, then downtown at Assembly. She eventually pivoted to campus executive chef at Adobe. During the pandemic things changed dramatically. She worked directly with their CEO and created "Kitchen Cabinet" to talk about what they could do to change their business model post-Covid. Prior to pandemic, they served 2500 people a day. Jessica likes this position, as it has a lot of purchasing power and effect on the industry. Sustainability at scale!

As somewhat of a "Plan B" for the post-pandemic world, Jessica started a pop-up restaurant called Chicken Foot. Chicken is the most common meat we eat, yet chicken feet are not normally used in American cuisine. They are often seen as "wrong" or "gross." Post-pandemic, she felt it was a great time to expand people's horizons around new ideas. The idea of fusion is inherently American since our country is a melting pot. Chicken Foot is dedicated to showcasing Jessica's family and culture. This past year she lost both grandmothers (one from Ukraine, 103, the other Canadian). When thinking about Chicken Foot this is what made food memorable for Jessica - her grandmothers' home cooking and hospitality. Jessica focuses her food around Eastern European comfort food like knish, pierogi, pelmeni, and babka. There's nothing else like it in Santa Cruz!

She uses a commercial kitchen by Costco and releases her menu to her mailing list and Instagram followers. You can pre-order and pick up from specified locations or find her at various farmers markets around the area. Now that things are starting to open up, she has been doing events like the Mid Town Block Party. Find her at chickenfootsc.com.
