Michael's passion was golf, but he somehow ended up in transportation!

He has 3 goals for the METRO agency:

- 1) Double ridership to 7 million rides a year within 5 years
- 2) Don't buy buses with tail pipes
- Develop 175 affordable housing units on METRO property by the end of the decade

They own 96 buses. All but 25ish of them are running at every given time.

METRO has never had 7 million riders. Even prior to COVID...but, they are optimistic! Gotta give the people fast, reliable, and frequent service to make that happen!

Riders want straight routes, buses to have priority at intersections, and buses to come often. That means a bus should come at least every 15 minutes!

Each bus costs \$1.3 million. It doesn't matter whether they are battery operated, electric, or hydrogen buses. Buses are EXPENSIVE!! Although, interestingly enough, the buses aren't owned by the METRO. They are owned by the Feds. And, the Feds have a lot of rules...

METRO (or the Feds?) will be buying 57 hydrogen buses this year!!

14 of the current buses are works of art. They show beautiful, scenic shots of nature around our county. It sounded like the METRO donates money to the environment for every ride that riders log into an app??? If that's true, that's super cool!
