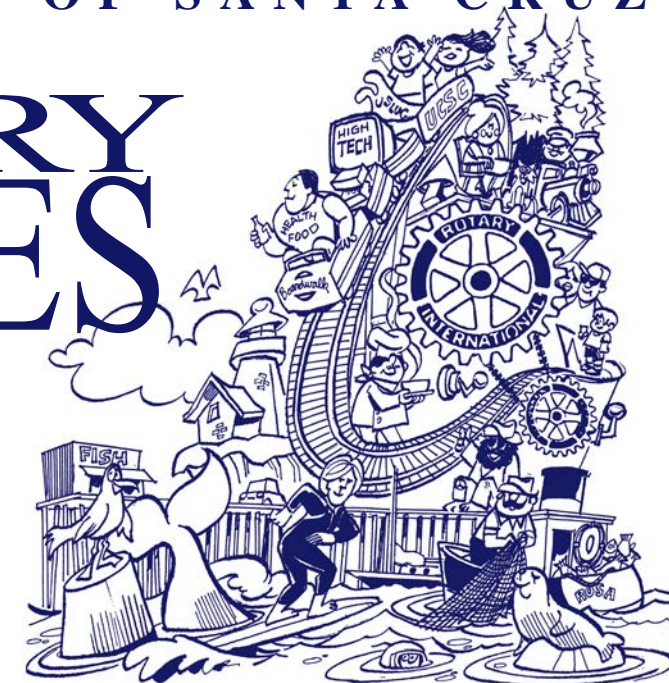

Rotarian *Kim Adamson* and her water management counterpart from Scotts Valley, *Piret Harmon*, made a terrific presentation on water management within Santa Cruz County.

Lots of interesting tidbits ... in particular order of importance, here are some of them:

- Ground Water overdraft is our biggest problem.
- 4 regular families use 1 acre foot of water per year. We currently are in deficit 1,150 acre feet in the county.
- Water Treatment Plants provide water for agriculture.
- All treated water flows in Purple Pipes.
- We need a minimum of 15” of rain to recharge groundwater sources.
- In Soquel, development is to be water use neutral. Development fees are used for ground recharging purposes.
